

1. Back in Exercise 1, you used a pearl-growing search strategy in the ERIC database to research recorded books (like the new "playaways") in libraries, focusing on their use by teenagers. Now that you've learned how to use the online thesaurus feature, re-do this search topic, taking advantage of the online thesaurus in your strategy. Comment on how the thesaurus influenced the process of the search and/or its outcome and results. Include 3 records that you consider to be the "best" ones for your intended purpose. **[2 points]** I decided that I would use the Thesaurus from the ERIC website rather than from the Dialog ERIC file, so I could explore features without the time crunch.

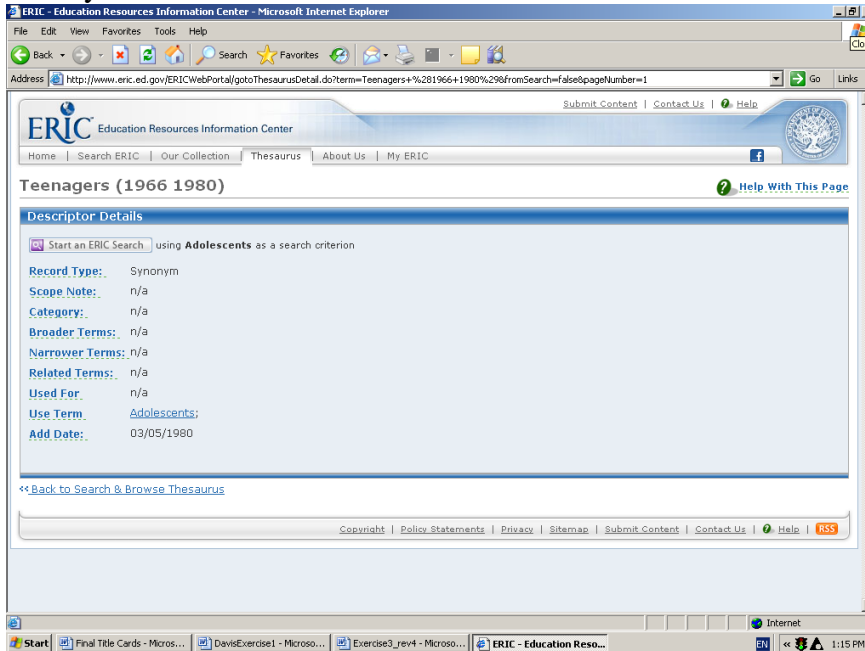
Very happy that you explored this version of the thesaurus. Adventuring into different search service features is important.

In the Thesaurus, I didn't get any results when I tried "playaway" or "recorded book." When I tried "audio book," I got zero results, but "audio books" is the preferred term. "Audio books" is used for books on tape, digital talking books, and talking books. There are no broader or narrower terms, but there are several related terms. When I entered the word teenagers, I was led to the term "adolescents."

inputted s animal(w)assisted(w)therapy(with no limits) and kept everything else the same. It wasn't much better (my first result was actually the same record I typed above), but I got a little more. Although I didn't include this in the search below, I also typed this "keyword" approach in format 8, so I could view the indexing. Only one record was indexed with animal assisted therapy as a descriptor, but other records were indexed differently (this also led me to realize that cats and dogs, not cat or dog, are formal descriptors). This illustrates how important it is to try a variety of approaches in both subject and keyword searching.

A due-process hearing officer has ruled that the Arkansas City (Kans.) school board acted improperly in firing a high school librarian for using the library computer to access sexually explicit sites on the Internet. Arkansas City High School Librarian Robert Hicks was terminated by the school district April 9, 2001, for inappropriate use of the Internet on school property, presenting a physical threat, and for poor utilization of the library by students.

Attorney Timothy Fielder's 30-page opinion, issued April 12, ruled that the district failed to show the use was inappropriate or violated school policy, the teacher's agreement, or even state law, according to the April 17 Arkansas City Traveler. "It is also apparent that Mr. Hicks's use of the Internet at school to access 'X-rated' sites ceased approximately a year prior to" his suspension November 14, 2000, Fielder wrote.

Hicks, who had worked at the high school since 1976, claimed at that time that he visited such sites "to determine ease of access by students to X-rated sites because there were no filters in place" and that he had raised these concerns with teachers and previous school administrators.

"It's an important case because of the Internet technology involved," Hicks told American Libraries. "It's been a long 18 months since I was suspended, but there were principles that I just had to stand up for. I thought it was worth explaining to teachers the rationale for Internet usage and how librarians handle unfiltered informational sources.

"The judge recognized the professional reasons why records of visiting some adult sites would be on a librarian's hard drive over a period of three years. But the district had a zero-tolerance policy and was not interested in finding out why a particular site was visited," Hicks added.

Fielder, who served as hearing officer for the case, also found no

evidence to support the charge that Hicks was responsible for students' lack of use of the library. "They tried to emphasize circulation records, which aren't analogous to library utilization anyway," Hicks said, "particularly if the library is online or automated."

Burden of proof unmet

Hicks told AL that the school district testified first at the due-process hearing. "After they made their argument, my lawyer, David Moses, made a motion to dismiss the case simply because the district failed to meet the burden of proof. We were all ready to go as far as putting on our defense, with more than 20 witnesses, mostly teachers from the high school. Then--pleasant surprise--the judge accepted the motion," he said.

Fielder also cited a police report that said Hicks did not present a physical threat to the superintendent or others at the school. "The local police declined to charge Hicks with any crime arising out of their investigation" of a comment he allegedly made at a restaurant that he was "packing metal," the report said. State law requires that a teacher first be convicted of a crime before being terminated.

A supplemental ruling, issued April 19 and inadvertently omitted from the earlier opinion, ordered the school board to reinstate Hicks as a media specialist for the district. At its May 13 meeting, the school board voted 5-2 to let Hicks go back to his previous job beginning in the fall.

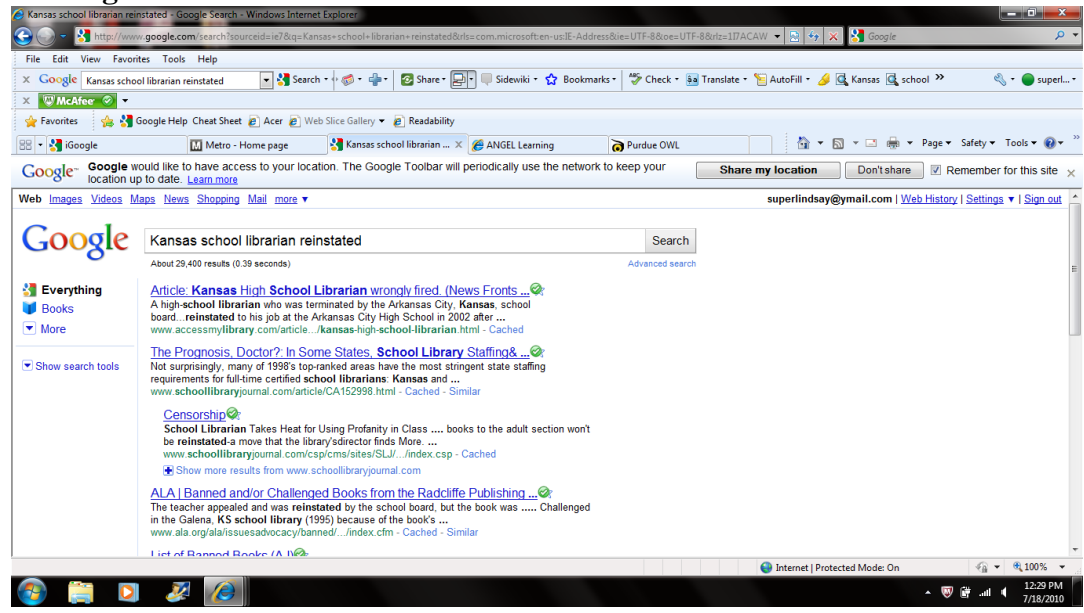
