The Rationales Behind Our Cataloging and Classification Decisions

- 1) We originally wanted to use a subject heading of Dwellings \$x Design and construction to create a subject access point for this title, but this particular term is considered a broad term and cannot be divided geographically. Once we decided that the subject was the architecture of the homes instead of the construction of homes, we constructed our subject headings to match and were able to subdivide it according to the location of the subject matter, Williamsburg, Virginia. Once we understood our subject better, we were able to place the dewey decimal number in the 728 (residential and related buildings) class versus the 690 (construction) of the Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) system. After using table one in the Dewey Services tab of OCLC Connexion to retrieve the number for geographic treatment (09), we then went into table two to add on a specific geographical region. Our number at this point was 728.09, then we continued with the following to get down to the city of Williamsburg:

Because we had an author main entry, we then retrieved the Cutter number for the author's last name.

To class the title in Library of Congress Classification (LCC), we did research in Classification Web to find a correlation between the DCC number and the LCC. In doing so, we found NA7238.W4 when we did research on the subject of domestic architecture. This string came up:

2) When constructing our LLC number, we searched for pollution and researched until we found this string:

[Environmental technology. Sanitary engineering--Special types of environment--Air pollution and its control](#)--Indoor air pollution

The string matched the subject matter, asbestos and the environmental effects in school buildings. It led us straight to the TD883.17 number. While constructing our DDC number, we chose to catalog it first under the 300's for the term asbestos in its social science context:

And then we added a 727 to this number in order to represent school buildings. This was found under a note in the 362-363 area that said add as appropriate under the number a 727 for buildings for educational and research purposes. Thus, our number became 363.738494727 to reflect all the subject matter information in the title.

- 3) After examining the title, we decided to classify this subject matter as ecology because of the 680 note present under ecology which stated that works on the interrelationships of organisms and their environment, as well as works on the composite of physical, biological and social sciences concerned with the conditions of the environment and their effects are entered under the term ecology. Therefore, we used this subject as the basis for both our LCC and DDC numbers. The word “problems” in the title, in this case, was subsumed under the definition of the heading “ecology.” For DDC, there was a specific number for ecology problems, which is what we used. We also cuttered the title using the title main entry scheme since there were more than four authors listed and none were given prominence.
- 4) To construct our DDC and LCC numbers, we looked at the title and examined the subject matter. We realized that the book was about two subjects, authors and illustrators. As none were given prominence, we classed the title under the first term that appears in the schedule. In both LCC and DDC, illustrators comes before authors, so we classified with illustrators as the primary subject. The LCC number reflects this:

It should be noted that many examples of books on illustrators and authors that we found that included the word “American” were actually classed in NC975, which is illustration in the U.S., but this did not seem accurate to us because of the lack of a geographic name in our title. While looking at the entire text might reveal geography, the title alone is not enough information.

Using illustrator as our primary subject, we then constructed our DDC number.

Then we added 810 for American literature in English and added the subdivision .92 to indicate the book deals with people, or a “persons treatment.” (Normally, this subdivision is .09 and then a 2 is added to make it specific to persons, but in the literature class, subdivisions do not contain the zero; rather, they follow the .1-.9 pattern.)

Going from there, we dealt with the double pagination mentioned in the abstract on the title by using AACR2 2.5, which stated that we should give the last numbered page, leaf or column in each sequence and then to follow it with the appropriate term or abbreviation. This led us to use “116 p., 125 p.”

To construct our subject headings in field 650, we knew we would have to create two different subject headings to illustrate the two different subject matters. We chose not

to subdivide our headings geographically since the title only said “American” and not the United States or U.S. Because we do not have access to the entire book, “American” could not be interpreted as the United States.

- 5) Constructing our DDC number for this title, we took the time to peruse every possible choice under the United States Navy.

We decided to go with the 359.33 number since it indicated a more administrative point of view from the Navy organization, and considering this title is coming from an administrative office dealing with administrative tasks such as vocational guidance, the number fits our subject matter. We then added the number for vocational guidance since we felt that the Navy was trying to give their personnel, veterans and employees, that type of guidance. We then constructed our 650 field using the main subject matter, the United States Navy and the subject of their book, vocational guidance. We knew we could subdivide the Navy portion with vocational guidance because under the term “vocational guidance” in OCLC Connexion was a note that read it could be subdivided under the names of corporate bodies and military services. Since the Navy fits that description, we used it. We also switched the field from a 650 field to a 610 field so that it followed an example from Practice Exercise 1, a corporate heading field. Based on an example of a defense paper that was used as an example during the last Elluminate session on December 6th, in which two related divisions were listed as

publishers, we also used both the Dept. of the Navy, Office of Retirement Affairs as the publisher of this title.

- 6) For this title, we did not include the 0973 on our DDC number to indicate the United States geographic region, nor did we subdivide our subject headings with the United States because the title did not reflect a specific region, just the struggle for women to earn the right to vote. Since this struggle has been seen the world over, it would have been assuming too much to believe that this title reflected only United States women.
- 7) For this DDC number, we used 004 for Computer Science and then added the 09 for historical treatment of the text. Our subject heading also reflects both aspects.
- 8) This title did not include a place where it was published, but after reviewing the publisher, WTKR News, in OCLC Connexion, we decided to use the location of the news station, in Norfolk, Virginia as the location in the 260 field. However, because this location was not confirmed by the title page, other preliminaries, or colophon, we put the location in brackets with a question mark to indicate that the location was not found in any prescribed source and is only assumed.
